School Board Report October 2015 Matthew Lattimore, Principal

Homecoming

We had a great homecoming week! Student council did a great job of planning and implementing all of the events. It all culminated with the dance on Friday night!

Exterior Athletic Complex

Had the pre-construction meeting with Peterson Companies. We covered the overall of the project and the timeline they are looking at for completion. Safety was the number one concern for all members at the table and thus we have communicated with our students and parents about Braham Area High School becoming a "Construction Zone" starting on Monday October 12th.

Greenhouse Update

The greenhouse project is still moving forward, but at a slower rate. Structure is here and put together. It can still go up when Peterson is done with that area. We are now looking to work with Peterson Companies to run the waterline to the greenhouse. We are still working with other companies and waiting on some permits to run the gas and electrical.

East Central Learning Academy

The counselors met to be updated on the program and to give input to the steering committee. The goal is to still have ECMLA up and running for the 2016-17 school year.

Pine Technical Meeting

Met with representatives from Pine Tech about the possibility of offering concurrent enrollment classes here at Braham for our students to earn college credit in the Career and Technical Education Department. We are looking at four courses; Measuring Tools, Blueprint Reading, Intro to Computer Aided Design, and Machining Fundamentals I. All these courses are embedded into courses that we currently offer. Another option we are exploring as well is 360 eTECH PSEO Options, which would be an online option for our students to take classes through a consortium of technical schools, but the students would remain in our building to do so. We are also looking at two site visits for our students to Pine Tech as part of their Cold Collar Career Day.

Curriculum Day

Staff went through a presentation on Close Reading Strategies from our own Jennifer Lundin. This will help staff implement another reading strategy into their curriculum. We also started the process of curriculum alignment. The board will see the same presentation and layout for the next few years tonight.

Karen Prigge-Leadership in Educational Excellence Award (LEEA)

Congratulations to Karen Prigge on being named our 2015 Braham Area High School Leadership in Educational Excellence Award winner! Karen works in our special education department. As stated by one of the individuals who nominated her, "Karen shows an outstanding example of how to be a teacher who cares for students in a professional way; she often sacrifices her prep period to help students better prepare for the next class, the next day, or for plans for the future."

Beth Stone is named Thrivent Financial Personal Finance Educator Award

Beth Stone will receive the *Thrivent Financial Personal Finance Educator Award*, which recognizes educators who increase student understanding of personal finance through original learning activities at the elementary and secondary levels. 1. ECMECC Operating Committee Meeting (Sept. 24) - Highlights:

- Ray Queener (Cambridge) was elected as the new chair
- Based on the recently completed strategic plan two new steering committees are being formed on the topics of technology and curriculum integration/professional development

- Negotiations with ECMECC staff will begin soon - committee composed of Queener - Cambridge, Gagner, and Truebenbach - Milaca. I will also serve as the supervising superintendent for Director Johnson
2. SEE General Meeting highlights (Sept. 25)
 - SEE goals: recruitment, retention, and outreach
 - 2015 legislative highlights - shared in Oct. 1 update
 - Reports on effective instructional practices (Kim Gibbons) and current public opinion and political trends (Morris Leatherman Company)
 - 2016 legislative platform focused on increased funding, tax relief, addressing the teacher shortage, early learning, and credentialing for concurrent enrollment
 3. MASA Fall Conference highlights (Sept. 27-29):
 - Shared in Oct. 1 update
 4. Isanti Children's Collaborative Meeting highlights (Sept. 30):
 - Charity Allen shared information regarding her role as the chemical dependency counselor in the C-I and Braham districts. Ms. Allen works approximately two days a week in Braham and has a caseload of 36 students. The most abused drugs are marijuana, alcohol, prescription meds, and meth. There is much support for the program with a wish that more of her time could be spent on preventative vs. reactive programing.
 - The budget appears on target for the fiscal year. It was noted that federal funds continue to show a decrease, which if continued, will eventually cause program cuts starting in 2017-2018.
 5. RRSEC - Governing Board Meeting highlights (Oct. 8):
 - Cost is about \$30,000 per student for service in a level 4 facility (doubles if para is required)
 - Enrollment figures were shared for Rum River East, North, and South - about as expected
 - The building currently being leased in Milaca (Rum River North) is being closely monitored to ensure student and staff safety. The original plan to lease a new building (provided by Milaca Schools) has hit a temporary snag. We are waiting for further word.
 6. I will participate with other Braham city officials in a community forum on October 21, starting at 7:00 p.m. at Cambridge-Isanti High School to share information on all things taxes. The public is invited to attend.
 7. Facilities Bond update:
 - A preconstruction meeting was held Oct. 6, and exterior work began October 12. Existing structures have been demolished and dirt work is in full swing.
 - Safety information was provided to the public through program inserts, School Messenger, Twitter, newspaper, and the school website. In addition all classroom teachers shared information with students.
 - Weekly meeting with the construction supervisor are scheduled and updates will be posted on the school website
 - Interior project bids will be released soon with bid opening scheduled for November 12
 - Future storage needs will require further planning / discussion

The following must be followed in order for a program to complete a Fundraiser:

1. If there is a contract needed for a fundraiser, permission must be granted by the Superintendent and approved by the School Board.
2. Fill out a Fundraiser Planning Sheet & Request Form and submit to the Activities Director at least three weeks in advance of the event.
3. Fill out a Fundraising Report and return to the Activities Director within two weeks of the completion of the Fundraiser.
4. No more than two fundraisers per activity will be allowed each school year, unless there is a special circumstance with prior approval from the Activities Director.
